(b) Developing engaging class activities	\$2,060 (December 2023) \$4,490 (July 2024)	Interactive activities deploying various tools, e.g. board games, effectively arouse students' interest in the subject.	The tools are reusable for future cohorts of students.

(a) Transportation subsidy to Civic Education Resource Centre	\$950 (October 2023) \$950 (November 2023)	The visit allowed students to acquire essential understanding about civil ideals portrayed in stories and exhibitions.	Department will explore similar activities next year.
(b) Transportation subsidy to HK Palace Museum	\$1,550 (January 2024)	Through the educational excursion, students displayed a deeper understanding of the origins and major characteristics of Chinese culture by comparing and contrasting different regions, cultures, ethnicities, and religions in the country.	Department will explore similar activities next year.
(c) Transportation subsidy to M+ and Tai Kwun	\$1,850 (April 2024)	The first-hand experience in appreciating both historical exhibits and modern arts presented students with the development of societies over the centuries. In addition, they could learn about cultural preservation in Hong Kong.	Department will explore similar activities next year.
(d) Materials related to Mainland Study Tour	\$696 (April 2024)	The provision of essential items, like SIM cards, ensured the effective communication between groups, and therefore the conveyance of information.	Department will explore different ways to maintain effective communication between groups in Tour.

(e) Transportation subsidy to Sam Tung Uk Museum	\$4,756 (May 2024)	The visit provided students an authentic insight into the lifestyle of villagers in the past, which is conducive to enhancing students' sense of belonging and national identity.	Department will explore similar activities next year.
(f) Subsidising teachers' and students' participation fee in visiting "Tai Hang Fire Dragon Dance"	\$10,360 (July 2024)	The visit helped students inherit Chinese culture deepen their understanding and sense of identity of individuals with Chinese nationality.	Department will explore similar activities next year.
